

bourgeoisie under the
Union and into the
emergence of the New
State, c.1790-1940.
The Lane Joynt family of
Limerick were of Huguenot
extraction and active in
Limerick business and
politics from the early
decades of the nineteenth
century.
In 1859, the Lane Joynt
family married into the
Glynn family of Kilrush
after being introduced at
the Kilkee Races.
The lecture is based on
substantial primary
material including many
fascinating photographs
which are held in the Glynn
archive & it tells the story
of the rise of a Limerick
merchant family in the
nineteenth century.
